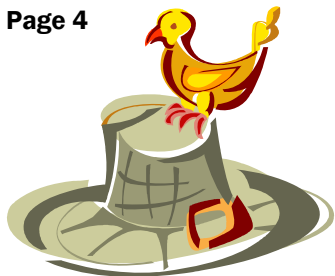
Correction to 2007 Pictorial Directory

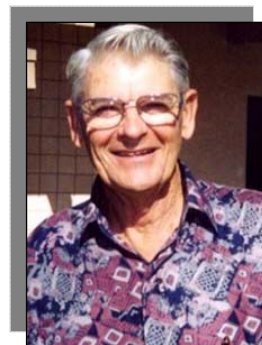

Missions Corner

Presbyterian Frontier Fellowship



Presbyterian Frontier Fellowship (PFF) - ever hear of it? Ever wonder just what it is all about?

PFF is about stepping out in creative witness among unreached people groups for whom the gospel is new. On the PFF web site, Rev. Bill Young, PFF Executive Director, states that "PFF wants every Presbyterian church to have a mission vision, in particular a vision to reach out to peoples who have no church. And we want newly planted churches to share that same vision for others."

What defines a people group? It is an ethnic group with specific language and customs. It is estimated that there are

nearly 8,000 people groups in which the Gospel has not taken root. These groups live in every country of the world, including the USA. They even live in our own little corner of California.

Started in 1981 as United Presbyterian Frontier Fellowship by Dr. Ralph Winter, the goal of PFF is "to support mission on the frontiers among unreached people groups; and to encourage first believers and first congregations as they claim Christ as their Lord and take on the call God has given all Christians."

In 1991, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church USA officially recognized this goal and in

1999, the PFF Board approved a mission statement encapsulating the mission of PFF as follows:

"We challenge, mobilize and empower Presbyterian congregations into global partnerships that establish indigenous churches among unreached people groups."

There are two connections which must come together in order for PFF to reach its goal: (1) For Every (established) Church: A Mission Vision, and (2) For Every People: An Indigenous church.

As an established church, Palm Desert Community Presbyterian Church can prayerfully support the

PFF mission by becoming more passionate in carrying out the Great Commission so that every ear will hear and every tongue will confess that Jesus is Lord.

At this writing, PFF field offices span the country coast to coast and are staffed by 11 Associate Directors with expertise and a passion to help churches connect with partners around the world who are involved in cutting-edge frontier mission work. Currently, over 60 different people groups on every continent are hearing the Good News of Jesus for the first time.
